PARKING TRUST FUND UPDATE

After months of discussion, drafting, and debate, the ad hoc parking committee appointed by the Village Board has come up with recommendations for changes to the Parking Trust Fund law. These changes will be presented at the October 13th Village Board Meeting. At that time the Village Board will decide when to have a public hearing on the proposed changes. We will notify you of this public hearing date in the Skaneateles Skinny and/or the November Newsletter.

Here is a synopsis of the recommended changes:

- **NO FEE TO BUSINESSES** for a lack of required parking spaces
- Scaling back the requirement for off-street parking spaces. Going forward, the only time a business would have to meet off street parking requirement guidelines are if they provide housing or overnight accommodations, AND for all uses in the Commercial “C” District, and for the “general” and “accessory” uses currently in the Code (IE, churches, schools, etc.) Off-street parking would not otherwise be required for the “D” District. So if you are opening a retail store or an office you not have to provide off street parking. If you are opening a restaurant in the Downtown “D” District you do not have to provide off street parking. However, if you are opening a hotel/b&B or inn you must provide the appropriate number of off street parking spaces. The rationale behind this is that we do not have an abundance of overnight spaces in the village, and the market demands that these uses generally require on site parking.

There is still time for public comment. Please note how far we have come from the original \$7500 parking space fee. Your input matters. Many thanks to the adhoc committee: Trustees John Crompt and Mary Sennett, Chamber Members Bob Eggleston and Arnie Rubenstein (With input from Sarah and Peter Wiles), and Chamber Director Sue Dove.
